The 'Two Up' Story

Two coins are placed tails up and marked with a white cross. They are placed on a kip - a small, flat piece of wood with a handle and sent up into the air.

British coins of Edward VII were usually used in Australian two-up games because "King Edward was neutral". This referred to the fact that weight either side of the coin was evenly distributed, unlike the Australian KGV pennies, where the weight favoured the obverse or heads side.

It is inextricably linked in the Australian psyche with 'diggers', a term for Australian soldiers, and in most places can only be played legally on ANZAC day. It has many different rituals associated with it, including the call 'Come in Spinner' which is a call made for the coins to be tossed once all bets have been laid.
